

TOO MUCH, TOO MANY & NOT ENOUGH

Too Much and Too Many

We use **“too much”** and **“too many”** to talk about a quantity that is bigger than we need or want.

Too much + uncountable noun

Eg: There is too much salt in this soup

Too many + plural countable noun

Eg: There are too many people on this bus!

Not Enough

We use **“not enough”** to talk about a quantity that is smaller than we want or need.

Not enough + uncountable noun or countable noun

*Eg: There is not enough sugar in my coffee
There aren't enough chairs for everyone*
