Learn to learn
Do we use the infinitive of a verb after:
a will b won't
◀ both will and won't?



WILL se usa para hablar sobre un hecho futuro o una predicción, algo que creemos que va a ocurrir.

Will va siempre seguido de INFINITIVO sin TO(be, live, work) tanto en forma afirmativa con WILL como en forma negativa con WON'T, como podéis ver en el **LEARN TO LEARN**.

La forma negativa es **WON'T** que es la contracción de **WILL +NOT**.

EXAMPLES;

I will be an astronaut= Yo seré astronauta

He will live in New York= Él vivirá en Nueva York.

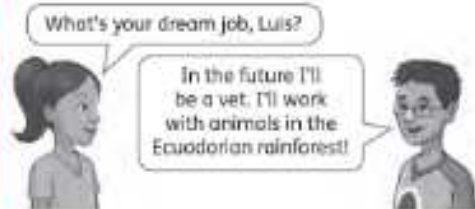
We won't work in an office= Nosotros no trabajaremos en una oficina.

 After *will / won't* we use the infinitive without *to*.
